The Matrix Center is a 60,000 sq. ft. community center on Detroit's Northeast side, owned by Matrix Human Services. Through collaboration with 150+ Mission Partners, individuals and families can gain access to free and low-cost services as well as resources to other community partners.

Located in Detroit's Osborn neighborhood, The Matrix Center serves thousands of families every year with vital programs & services in one of Detroit's most impoverished zip codes. The on-site presence of Matrix provides visitors with a safe space for youth, adult, and senior programming, as well as food distributions, community events & recreational activities, a free-use computer lab, a local polling location, and much more.

Programs & services at The Matrix Center are designed to meet the needs of Northeast Detroit residents from youth to senior age. The Center's programming includes education and workforce services, housing services, after-school youth activities, youth spring & summer camps, senior health, transportation, and recreation services, and a hub for community resources. ADULT SERVICES

Financial Empowerment Center—Services to assist clients in reaching their personal economic upward mobility goals including one-on-one financial coaching and counseling, free credit reports & FICO scores, financial capabilities classes, and tax prep assistance (during tax time only).

Workforce development Center—Services that include soft skills training, one-on-one career coaching and counseling, resume, cover letter & job search assistance, employment resources, and referrals.

Housing Center—Matrix Human Services is a certified HUD Local Housing Counseling Agency providing one-on-one pre-purchase homebuyer counseling, rent counseling, and post-purchase counseling as well as group education workshops.

Education Center—The 100% Online High School Diploma Program makes it possible to achieve a high school diploma after graduation for free on a schedule that works for you.

Resource Center—Matrix connects those in need of emergency food, shelter, clothing, hygiene, and other necessities, with organizations and services that can help.

Center for Seniors—Comprehensive services for anyone 55+ that includes assistance with transportation to medical appointments, home care services to help clients remain living in their homes, and the Healthy Senior Living Initiative provides “a prescription” of fresh produce to senior’s doorsteps. Participants also receive access to the HUDA clinic for affordable healthcare regardless of coverage.

Leaps & Bounds—Provides one-on-one quality improvement support for in-home and childcare centers and specialized services to enable providers to gain their CDA, a national credential. All services are free. For more information call 586-759-3895

Food for Health Program—Matrix launched the Food for Health program in 2021 with the hope of helping more families and children in Detroit become healthier. Participants age 18 to 54 receive fresh produce and non-perishable foods twice per month and quality, affordable healthcare.

Detroit at Work / Skills for Life Program—Start the next step in your career and life. Participants are paid \$15 / hr, 5 days a week, to receive education toward a GED or vocational training toward a career, while working with the City of Detroit on beautification projects.

YOUTH SERVICES

Matrix Youth Assistance Program (YAP) - Provides after-school and in-school youth services including academic support, recreational activities, conflict resolution, cultural activities, computer classes, substance abuse prevention, and extra-curricular sport partnerships for youth ages 10-17. These services are available from 4 pm – 6 pm during the school year and 11am – 4 pm during the summer.

Black United Fund - Youth empowerment programs including classes in health & wellness, financial literacy, coding, medicine, aviation, and more.

Grow Detroit Young Talent - Works with youth ages 14-24 and is designed to provide real-world job experience while developing leadership, employability skills, professionalism, and provides access to Child Development Associate Training.

Spring & Summer Camp - The Matrix Youth Assistance Program (YAP) provides youth with an alternative spring break, including games, activities, and field trips hosted by our Youth Program Counselors. During the summer, our Youth Summer Camp provides kids with a safe space to enjoy programming 5 days a week, including games, outdoor activities, field trips, computer time, and 2 meals per day.
